Founded in October 2000, the United Breast Cancer Foundation (UBCF) is a platinum-rated 501(c)(3) nonprofit that started as a grassroots organization in New York State, serving low-income, uninsured, and underinsured women and men. In 2005, the foundation expanded its reach to serve the national community. Headquartered in Huntington Station, NY, we assist women, men and their families across the country through various life-supporting patient and family programs.

Our President & Executive Director, Ms. Stephanie Mastroianni, has led UBCF since 2001, transforming the charity into the impactful organization that it is today. Her drive is deeply personal, inspired by her experience and the loss of her mother, Audrey Beverly Christy Mastroianni (pictured left), who passed away from breast cancer at the age of 42.

Honoring Audrey's memory, UBCF remains committed to our mission, supportive programming, and superior client care.





Dear Supporters, Clients, and Friends,

As I reflect on 2023, I am proud to say it was a year of progress and achievement for United Breast Cancer Foundation (UBCF). This year has been marked by growth and transformation, and I'm excited to share some of the milestones we've reached and the initiatives we've launched or expanded to strengthen UBCF's financial and operational stability.

Highlights from 2023:

- ★ UBCF earned a 4-star rating with Charity Navigator, and maintained our Platinum rating with Candid (Guidestar).
- ★ UBCF was the Official Title Patient Sponsor for Twisted Pink's Gala and other activities in support of metastatic breast cancer research and patient support.
- ★ We participated in the Combined Federal Campaign for the 11th consecutive year.
- ★ UBCF hosted its Mattress Donation Event that included a major Pink Bag Event in September, gifting products valued at \$1.5+ million to more than 275 people.
- ★ UBCF continued to collaborate with Brookfield Properties, a global real estate management firm, to host 20 UBCF Pink Bag Events at locations throughout the US, distributing \$1.85+ million in products and reaching thousands of patients & survivors.
- ★ Our Network of Giving Program distributed \$19+ million in donated in-kind products. We welcomed 22 new Charity Members, and we vet new organizations regularly.
- ★ UBCF worked with many smaller Charity Members to ensure they receive helpful products to support their communities.
- ★ UBCF's financial grant programs awarded more than \$1.83 million in financial support to over 2,840 individuals! Our Programs team grew this year to ensure that each applicant receives the unique, one-on-one support that defines our approach.

- ★ UBCF's Holiday Give Campaign distributed an incredible \$600k to 800 recipients!
- ★ UBCF launched its Internal Car Donation Program. This new initiative is a major undertaking, requiring significant coordination across many departments. The program aims to increase net revenue for UBCF while significantly reducing fundraising costs, helping us better serve the breast cancer community.
- ★ Our Call Center continues to make significant strides. It's not your traditional telemarketing center—our unique, in-house platform allows us to build genuine relationships with our donors and provide personalized care for our clients.
- ★ Direct Mail initiative: upon my direction we are using a new fulfillment and caging firm and the results were outstanding. This is now a monthly on-going campaign.
- ★ We are working with a production company to develop and refine various Public Service Announcements. We are proud to include Ms. Vivica A. Fox in our PSA to help us raise awareness as well as funds to support UBCF's mission and programs.
- ★ I was honored to be named the recipient of Twisted Pink's Dace Polk Brown Award at their annual Gala, "An Evening Inspired" held on July 28th. This was a very special and unexpected honor, in recognition of my unyielding commitment to inspire and empower the breast cancer community nationwide.
- ★ This November, we suffered the unexpected passing of our beloved Board Member and former Executive Assistant, Lauren Brohm. She was deeply passionate, always positive, and so hard working - making miracles happen daily with our "small but mighty" team. No matter what she was involved in, she would make the "impossible" possible. Her unwavering positivity and ability to build relationships were truly unmatched. I am committed to forever honoring her memory, and celebrating her legacy.

As we reflect on this year's achievements, we are reminded that UBCF's success is made possible by the collective effort of our dedicated team, our generous supporters, and the inspiring individuals we serve. We look forward to the year ahead, continuing our work with passion, purpose, and a deep commitment to the breast cancer community.

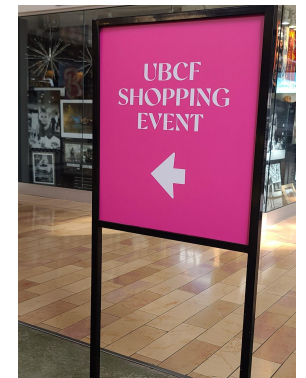

What makes UBCF Unique?

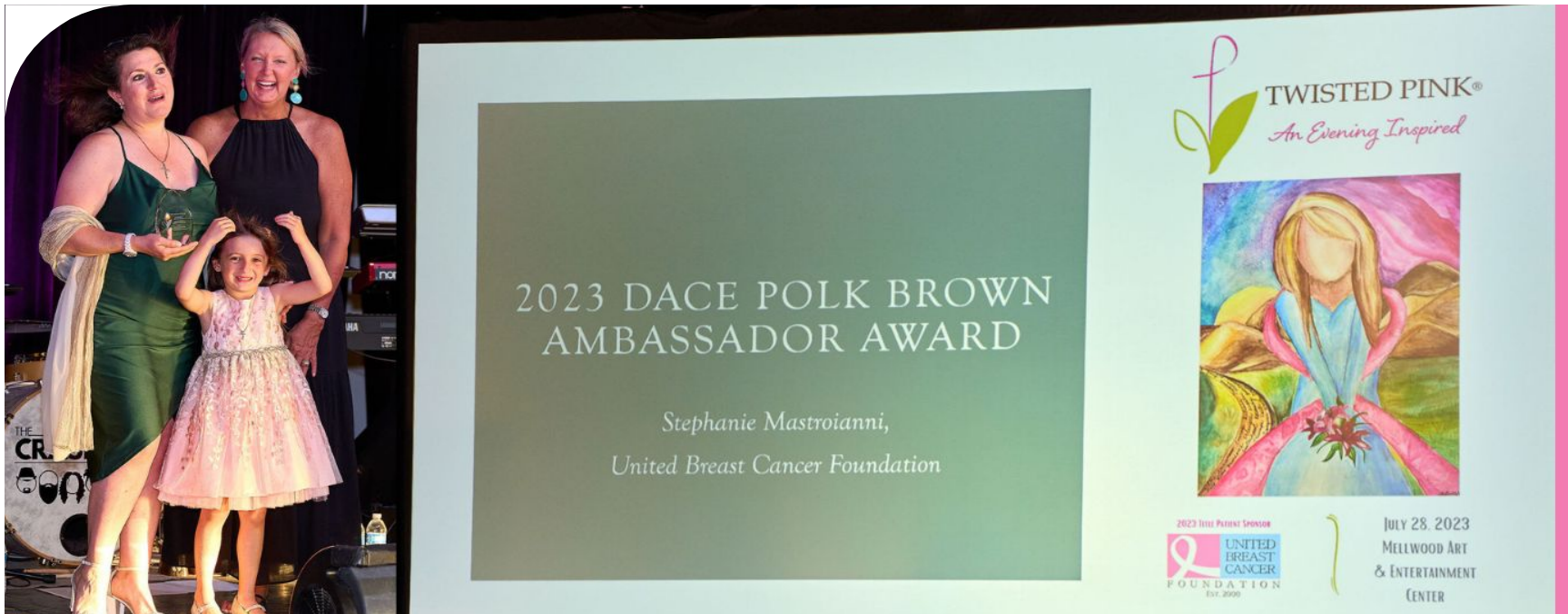
There are many organizations doing good work, and UBCF stands out from the pack.

- ★ UBCF offers superior client care - applicants are guided through each step of the way and receive follow-up support as needed. Our clients are people - not numbers.
- ★ People are welcomed and encouraged to apply for assistance through more than one program at a time.
- ★ We know cancer impacts the entire family - UBCF's program services support family members as well as patients.
- ★ UBCF's grants are generous - the average Individual Grant award is \$1,700.00!
- ★ UBCF offers financial assistance as well as generous, helpful and quality donated products like clothing, shoes, personal care products, makeup, items for kids, and even restorative mattresses. Our gifts lift spirits and shine a beacon of hope for so many, especially when funds are limited and purchasing new clothes, shoes, personal care items, or a mattress is out of the question.
- ★ UBCF has worked hard to reduce overhead to ensure that a greater percentage of donated funds reach those in need. As of UBCF's most recently reported fiscal year, 88.18% of UBCF's expenses are program service related.

UBCF and Brookfield Properties collaborate on Pink Bag Events® during Breast Cancer Awareness Month

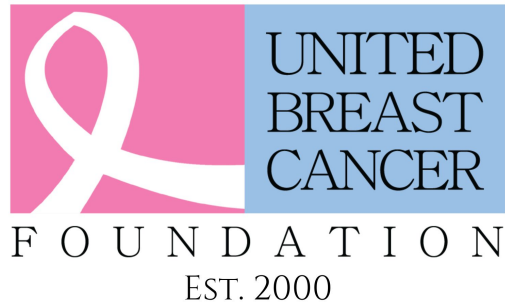
UBCF and Brookfield Properties collaborated for the second consecutive year to support breast cancer patients and survivors at Pink Bag Events across the country this past October. Event attendees received beautifully curated Pink Bags filled with gifts delivering joy and hope. The two organizations worked together for months to plan 20 events where thousands of patients and survivors were celebrated.



1 in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime, and men can develop breast cancer too. While that information is shocking, there is hope. When detected early and localized, there is a 99% survival rate. Events like the UBCF Brookfield Pink Bag Events raise awareness and bring hope to many. Often during and after treatment, funds are so tight and people are unable to purchase anything other than the bare necessities. A Pink Bag full of gifts delivers a ray of sunshine to someone who may be struggling. Katie, an event attendee shared, “Wonderful gifts! I love all of the beauty products and perfume!! The socks are so cute and I love the leopard slippers. Thank you so much!”

Brookfield Properties is a retail real estate company that operates over 130 shopping centers throughout the United States. Through this collaboration, Brookfield Properties provided space in 20 of their locations to conduct UBCF Pink Bag Events®. During the events, Pink Bags were gifted to breast cancer patients and survivors and include items such as beautiful cosmetics and makeup brushes, jewelry, cozy socks, headwraps, soap and more. They also contain promo items such as lip balm, hand sanitizer, and educational brochures.

United Breast Cancer Foundation offers a range of program services designed to assist individuals and families impacted by breast cancer, as well as those in need of screening services. We provide education, financial grants, high-quality donated products, and compassionate support to help alleviate stress and guide individuals through their journey with greater ease.

UBCF Patient & Family Programs

Audrey B. Mastroianni College Scholarship

This scholarship is designed to help turn higher education dreams into reality for students who have lost a parent or guardian due to breast cancer. The scholarship was established in honor of Audrey B. Mastroianni, a firm believer in education and continued personal enrichment.

Breast Reconstruction

UBCF understands that a woman faces many physical challenges and emotional decisions after a mastectomy. It is important for women recovering from breast cancer to have every opportunity to regain their confidence. UBCF is here to help make reconstruction possible.

Breast Screening

The Breast Screening Program financially supports women and men in need of breast screening services. UBCF contributes to the cost of various screening technologies such as mammography, ultrasound and thermography. Early detection helps save lives!

Child Sponsorship

The entire family is impacted by a breast cancer diagnosis. UBCF developed this program to support children 18 and under living in homes directly impacted by breast cancer, including those that have suffered the loss of a parent.



Community Service

UBCF's Network of Giving provides helpful Gift-in-Kind donations to women, men, and families in need. Donations often include clothing, shoes, household items and mattresses. Community Service also includes education & awareness campaigns and organizational grants.

COVID / Emergency Assistance Program

UBCF developed this program to provide effective and expedited relief to women and men impacted by breast cancer during the COVID pandemic, and rebranded in 2023 as the "Emergency Assistance Program". EAP serves to provide assistance with quick turnaround time.

Holistic Care

Many breast cancer patients choose to pair holistic and complementary techniques with cutting edge western medicine. UBCF supports clients in their treatment plan by assisting with the cost of holistic modalities that are generally not covered by insurance and can be quite costly.

Individual Grant

UBCF provides customized financial support geared towards an individual's personal needs and circumstances. Like our clients, no two grants are ever alike. Assistance covers medical expenses and procedures, cost of living expenses, COBRA insurance, and more.

Audrey B. Mastroianni College Scholarship

Mark reached out to UBCF during his senior year, seeking a scholarship to assist with his college education at Penn State. Sadly, he lost his mother, Alicia, to a 4-year battle with inflammatory breast cancer. In Mark's application, he shared, "One of the last things my mom did for me was to make me a birthday drawing on our chalkboard that is still hanging in our kitchen. My mom took the time to do this for me even after all of her struggles. This showed how much my mom cared for me and for us and it is priceless.... I always want to do my best and, like my mom, not stop trying... Since she didn't give up, why should I?"

UBCF believes in Mark - and his mother's legacy. We awarded him a generous scholarship to help cover his tuition.

Mark had this to share, "I wanted to say thank you to United Breast Cancer Foundation (UBCF) for considering me for the Audrey B Mastroianni College Scholarship Award. I recently discovered the United Breast Cancer Foundation and they changed this upcoming school year and my life. This award really helps out immensely and makes things easier on all of my family. It takes a massive burden off of our shoulders with me starting college and my brother starting high school. The Foundation makes the process of applying for this scholarship very easy and they want to help people and families who have been affected by this horrible disease. They are extremely generous and also make it very easy to contact them if you have any questions. UBCF will work with you and will give you answers back very quickly. Some scholarships you may not hear back from but you will from this one. I lost my mother to breast cancer and they are always pushing you to apply and finish applications through daily emails because they want to be able to make a difference in people's lives like they did for my family. In the future my family and I plan on starting our own scholarship in memory of mom and to award families who need it. Thank you again. I included a picture of my mom, so as you know who you have helped."



Breast Reconstruction

Meet Vina, a 44 year old, single Filipina woman living in New York City. In her application she explained that her medical debt has been a tremendous burden. Each step in her treatment has resulted in another payment plan, and when she gets close to paying off one expense, she begins to anticipate future invoices.

Vina describes her financial situation; "...I've experienced hikes in my monthly premium (most notably since my cancer diagnosis), deductible, and out-of-pocket costs while the availability and quality of services have declined. I'll only be able to work part-time while I undergo occupational therapy for the next month to recover from my bilateral mastectomy and DIEP flap surgeries as well as immunotherapy for the next 6 months. While I'm fortunate to live in a rent-stabilized apartment, the cost of living remains high in [NYC]. I make just enough to pay my bills but don't have expendable income."

We hear from so many clients who live paycheck to paycheck and when disaster strikes in the form of a cancer diagnosis, their whole world starts to crumble.

"I'm grateful to UBCF for recognizing that the cost for breast reconstructive surgery may be a significant burden for breast cancer patients such as myself who have incurred medical debt (e.g., from chemotherapy and other medical treatments and procedures) on top of an increased monthly insurance premium, deductible, and out-of-pocket costs. Having been diagnosed with breast cancer at 43, DIEP flap reconstruction (rather than flat closure) was the right decision for me as part of my physical and emotional healing process. Regardless of our socioeconomic status, we all deserve to be able to make the best healthcare decisions for ourselves. Thank you for helping ensure that all, especially the most vulnerable communities, have access to life-saving and self-affirming breast reconstruction."

After receiving her award email notifying her that we would pay the outstanding balance on her surgical bill, Vina was another client at a loss for words-

"Thank you for this great news! I appreciate beyond words the foundation's support to pay down my medical debt from my breast reconstruction surgeries."





Breast Screening

Meet Aggie - wife and mother of two living in California. Aggie reached out to UBCF in need of financial assistance for a breast screening - she was concerned about some changes and has a family history of cancer.

Aggie received financial assistance through UBCF's Breast Screening Program to stay proactive in her breast health. Some abnormalities were found that Aggie addressed with her medical team. Aggie shared the following:

“United Breast Cancer Foundation has been a Godsend to me and my family. I found the program by chance while searching many ways to scan for breast cancers. I was never one to go with a mammography but knew it was the only option doctors provide covered by [insurance]. When I finally found the option that best suited my choices..., I knew I had to pay everything out of pocket. I then came across UBCF on search engine and read about the award toward breast scan expenses. I didn’t know if I would qualify but knew if I didn’t try I would possibly have to delay the scan appointment. I was so happy to hear I was awarded the grant for the ultrasound because now the abnormalities found on results can be addressed with my regular doctor and I don’t have to stress over the financial part while trying to figure out what’s next for my “little ladies”.

I thank this foundation from the bottom of my heart for helping me even with just the scan but also helping many others who are cancer patients or survivors to ease the stress during the difficult times.

I will never forget this and will always tell everyone about how ***UBCF saved my life :) THANK YOU! <3***”

Child Sponsorship

Rachel is a 39 year old single mother of two. When she was first diagnosed with breast cancer she was separated from her child's father and received only \$167.00 per month from him. She stopped working early on in her treatment because it was too hard to work through chemotherapy.

Rachel first came to UBCF in 2021 when her diagnosis was new - she was applying for disability and needed assistance. We helped her with payment of her children's school tuition.

Rachel reached out again, sharing that she has been in and out of the hospital and that she continues to struggle financially.

In her Child Sponsorship Grant Application, Rachel said, "Cancer takes a lot from you, but it has also taught me so much. It has taught me to take nothing for granted. I cannot express the gratitude that I have for everyone who has helped me along my journey back to health with mere words. UBCF has helped my family in the past and I would appreciate any additional assistance they may be able to provide my children and me now."

Rachel trusted UBCF, like turning to an old, dependable friend, and once again, we showed that we are here for her and her children. She was so grateful to be awarded financial assistance again to help with her children's school tuition.



United Breast Cancer Foundation Mattress & Pink Bag Event®

On Saturday, September 23, UBCF provided hundreds of breast cancer patients and survivors therapeutic and restorative mattresses as well as complimentary "shopping". UBCF's Mattress and Pink Bag Event®, valued at over \$1.5 million, was made possible thanks to generous collaborations with the community. More than 100 people received mattresses and over 275 people attended the complimentary "shopping" portion of the event. UBCF has distributed more than 4,350 mattresses in numerous states to those in need since 2012.



One of our event attendees, Emma, escaped an abusive relationship when her youngest child was only 1 year old. Soon after, she was diagnosed with breast cancer and faced serious financial hardship. Emma and her children were gifted mattresses and other quality gifts from UBCF during an event last fall. She shared,

“Chemotherapy has left me with so much bone and joint pain. Surgery, drains, lymphedema and cording have made sleeping very difficult and uncomfortable. Having a new mattress may not be a big deal for other people, but for me? It means the whole world! Just to think that I am finally going to be able to have a comfortable mattress and that I will get a good night sleep is going to change a lot of my quality time. Sleeping is a very important part of the healing process and being approved to receive a new mattress is a huge blessing.

Individual Grant

Lucy was diagnosed with ER+/PR+ HER 2 negative infiltrating ductal carcinoma with lymph node involvement. Scared and devastated, she reached out to United Breast Cancer Foundation requesting support through our Individual Grant Program.

In her application, Lucy shared, *"ANY assistance, no matter how small would be greatly appreciated. Our mortgage would be the most helpful. Int has been extremely hard for me, not contributing financially... my lack of income has been a huge strain on my family... We have maxed out our [credit cards] to cover expenses."*

UBCF answered the call and awarded Lucy a grant to assist with her mortgage.

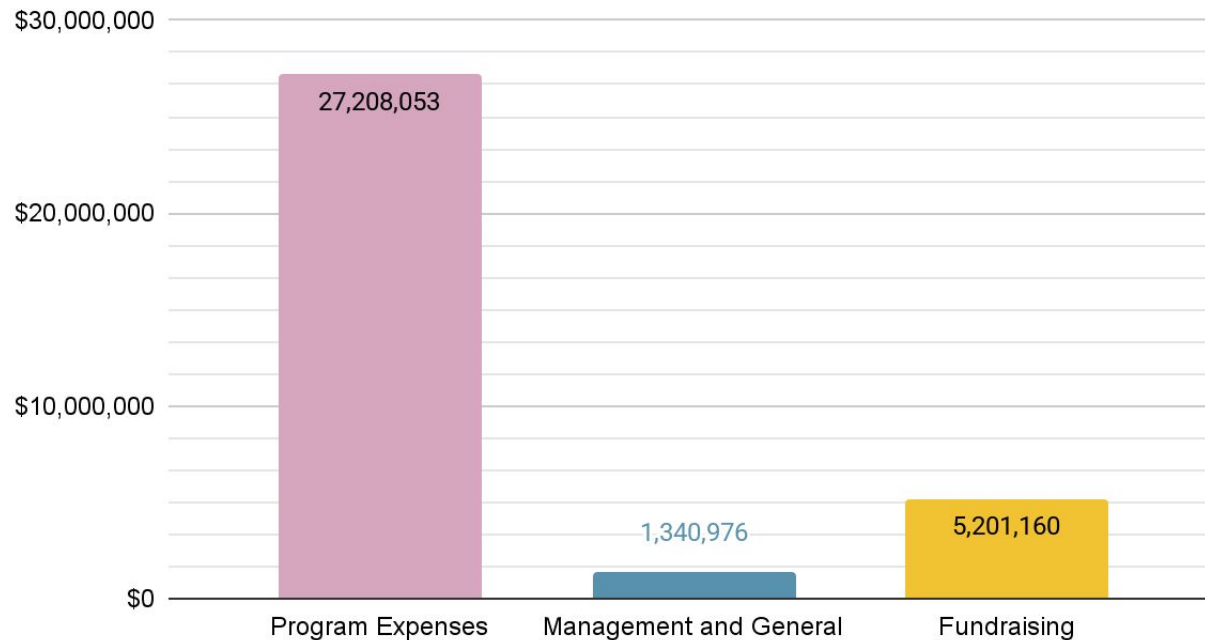

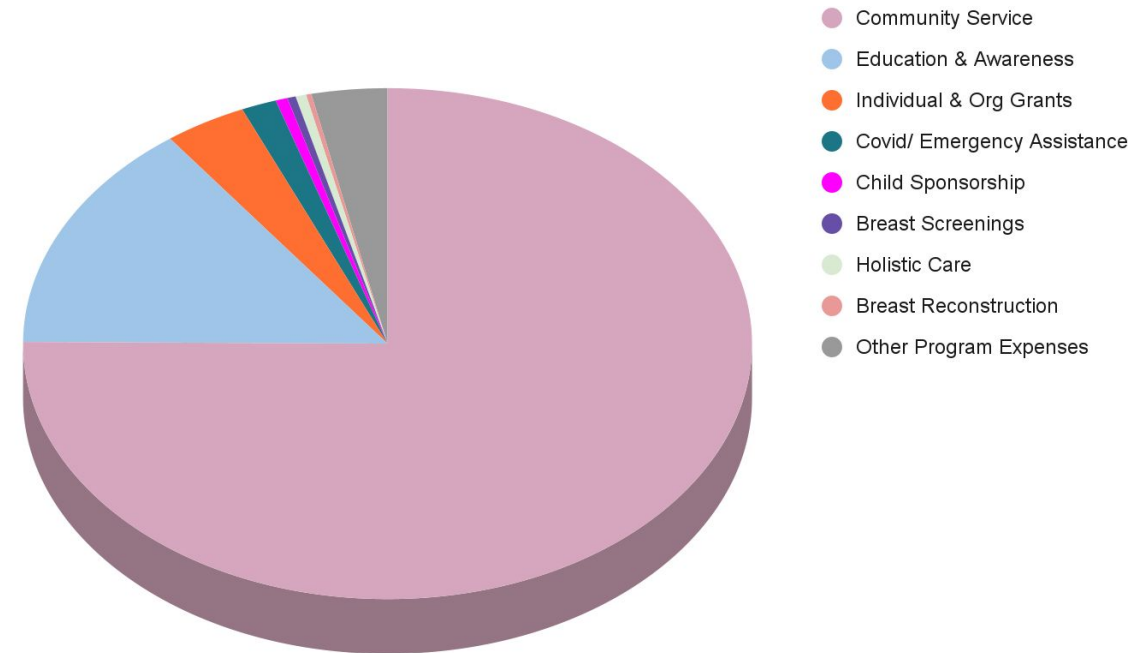

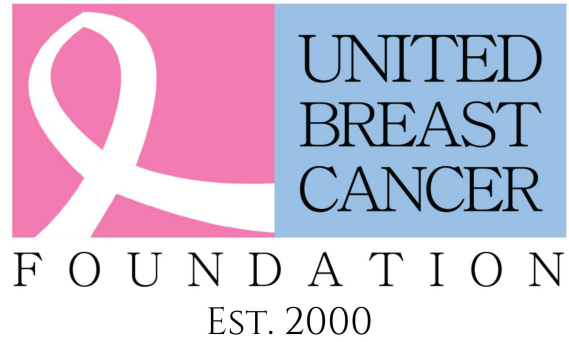
